TIPS FOR PREPARING FOR A JOB FAIR

1. Dress Appropriate: Dress for the Job Fair the same way you would for an interview. No jeans, T-Shirts, flip flops, clothes with holes, or club attire.
2. Custom Resumes: Bring several copies of your resume, but also bring a couple of different resumes. For example, if you know you are interested in both healthcare and business, bring separate resumes to address those interest.
3. The Rule of 15: Assume you are at the Job Fair 15 minutes before you actually arrive. Do not be an aggressive driver because the person you pull out in front of might be a potential employer at the Job Fair.
4. Remember People Are Watching: As you are approaching the venue of the Job Fair you will likely encounter people in the parking lot or outside the building, those same people could be potential employers outside taking a break.
5. Be Engaging: Talk to the employers, engage in a conversation, and find out all you can about the company.
