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Medical Records Transcribing Program (MDTR-ATD)

The Medical Records Transcribing program is designed to prepare graduates for employment as medical transcriptionists. Medical transcriptionists listen to dictated recordings made by physicians or other healthcare providers, and then transcribe this information into medical reports, correspondence, and other administrative material. They generally listen to recordings on a headset, using a USB foot pedal to pause the recording when needed, and key the text using word processing software, editing as necessary for grammar and clarity. These documents eventually become part of patient's permanent health records.

To understand and accurately transcribe dictated reports into a format that is clear and comprehensive for the reader, medical transcriptionists must have excellent keyboarding skills, be proficient in word processing, understand medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, diagnostic procedures, pharmacology, and treatment assessments. To help identify terms appropriately, transcriptionists refer to standard medical reference materials—both printed and electronic.

The majority of transcriptionists often work from home and are employed by hospitals, physician groups, transcription services, clinics, laboratories, medical libraries and government medical facilities. Average salaries are in the range of \$16.36 per hour / \$34,020 per year.

Outlook

According to the U. S. Department of Labor, *Occupational Outlook Handbook*, "employment of medical transcriptionists is projected to grow 8 percent from 2012 to 2022, about as fast as the average for all occupations. The growing volume of healthcare services is expected to continue to increase demand for transcription services. However, employment growth will be limited due to increased productivity stemming from technological advances."

- High school diploma or GED
- College and/or high school transcripts
- Minimum 2.0 GPA
- Completion of Health-Related Program Application

- Keyboarding Proficiency Test (45 CWAM)
- Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) {Minimum Scores: Reading/11 Language/11 Math/10}
