Google Scholar FAQs

What is Google Scholar?

Google's attempt to create "a simple way to broadly search for scholarly literature."

What's in it?

- Articles from professional & industrial organizations, academic presses, public online scholarly resources that have agreed to participate
- Articles from .edu sites
- "Scholarly" (peer reviewed) articles from public web
- Articles that require payment
- References (citations) to articles & books found in publications identified by Google

What do you get?

- Text of some articles
- Links to books in Google Books
- References to related articles
- Lists of papers which cite an article
- Links to articles that require payment
- Connect to your library's databases for the text of the article (see Setting Preferences to Pensacola State College on next page)

How do you search?

- Same as Google
- Advanced Search allows search by author, publication, date, subject area
- Results sorted by popularity

What should you know about Scholar?

- No list of publishers/publications
- Frequency of updates unknown
- Coverage unknown
- No definition of what is considered scholarly
- Covers <u>only a portion</u> of scholarly literature
- No magazines or newspapers (this is changing)
- Gaps in coverage

Where can you get MORE & FREE articles?

- Your local library article databases at <u>http://library.pensacolastate.edu</u> at the Databases tab, Project Starter Databases
- Log in with your Pensacola State ID barcode number and the last 4 numbers of your Social Security number

Generally, if a link appears on the right of the Google Scholar hits, the link will lead to the text.

- 1. Title Links to abstract of the article. *Generally*, if no link on the right, the text must be purchased
- **2. FullText** @ **Pensacola State** Links to Pensacola State College library article databases to find article. Requires login with Pensacola State ID card barcode and last four numbers of SSN
- 3. Cited by Identifies papers that have cited the article
- **4. Related articles** Finds other papers similar to one listed
- **5. Cite** Sample MLA, APA & Chicago citation (check against citing guidelines!)
- **6. Save Save to your Scholar Library** (requires login to your Google account)
- **7. Book** indicates book title from Google Books. To see text, if available, click on title. Sometimes allows for *Find in Library* to see if Pensacola State or other libraries nearby have the book
- 8. PDF or HTML versions of the paper appear to the right. These generally do not require payment

Setting Google Scholar Preferences to Pensacola State College

Setting Google Scholar Preferences to Pensacola State will allow Scholar to access full-text articles from Pensacola State College subscription databases. On campus, the college's IP address allows access without setting preferences. From off campus, setting preferences allows users to access Pensacola State College's articles by prompting for a log in. The log in is the 14 digit barcode number from the Pensacola State College ID card and the last 4 digits of the Social Security number. Scholar can be found at http://scholar.google.com

Step 1. Click on Settings

Step 2. Click on Library Links

Note: You can set Results per page to 20 on this screen

Step 3. Enter *Pensacola* in the search box.

Step 4. Select Pensacola State College – Full Text@Pensacola State

Click **Save**. Scholar will present initial search screen (you will also see results for Open WorldCat)
